NUESTRA MISIÓN

La palabra misión viene del latín “*missus*” que significa “enviado.” Dios Padre envió a Su Hijo y, mientras vivió en este mundo, Él “quiso triturar a Su Siervo con el sufrimiento.” (1ra lectura: Is 53, 10-11) La misión del Hijo de Dios fue cumplir el plan divino de redimir a la humanidad. Esto fue realizado a través del sufrimiento. “*Con Sus sufrimientos justificará Mi Siervo a muchos, cargando con los crímenes de ellos.*” En este mundo, Cristo vivió como un siervo. Escuchamos en el Evangelio de hoy (Mc 10, 35-45) que Él les dijo a Sus apóstoles, “*El Hijo del hombre...no ha venido a que lo sirvan, sino a servir y a dar Su vida por la redención de todos.*” Hoy, la Iglesia continua la misión de Cristo. Movida y guiada por el Espíritu, se esfuerza para que todos puedan salvarse. *Todos los miembros de la Iglesia están llamados a participar en la misión de Cristo* aunque de diferentes maneras. Nuestra responsabilidad como Cristianos es de anunciar la Buena Nueva de Cristo, dando testimonio de la misericordia, el poder, la sabiduría y el amor de Dios, y siendo instrumentos vivos de Dios para que Él llame, convierta, salve, liberte, sane, santifique, bendiga y ayude a los demás a través de nosotros según Su Espíritu nos capacite. Para que nuestra misión sea lo mas eficaz posible, debemos perfeccionar cada vez mas nuestra unión con Cristo, y ser fieles, en nuestras creencias y prácticas, al Magisterio de la Santa Iglesia Católica. Entonces, nuestra misión será una de servicio, caridad y humildad, buscando la gloria de Dios, y la salvación de los demás.

OUR MISSION

The word mission comes from the Latin “*missus*” which means “send.” God the Father sent His only Son and, while He lived in this world, “*The Lord was pleased to crush him (Jesus) in infirmity.*” (1st reading: Is 53:10-11) The Son of God's mission was to fulfill the divine plan to redeem humanity. This was accomplished through suffering. “*Through His suffering, My servant shall justify many, and their guilt He shall bear.*” In this world, Christ lived as a servant. In today's Gospel (Mk 10: 35-45) we hear Him tell His apostles, “*The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many.*” Today, the Church continues Christ's mission. Moved and guided by the Holy Spirit, She does all that She can so that all may be saved. *All members of the Church are called to participate in Christ's mission,* though in different ways. Our responsibility as Christians is to announce the Good News of Christ, by giving testimony of God's mercy, power, wisdom and love, and by being living instruments so that He may call, convert, save, free, heal, sanctify, bless and help others through us as the Holy Spirit empowers us. In order for our mission to be as effective as possible, we must perfect more and more our union with Christ, and be faithful, in our beliefs and practices, to the Magisterium of the Holy Catholic Church. Then, our mission will be one of service, charity, and humility, seeking God's glory, and the salvation of all.
